Baile Mhuire, Day Care Centre, Tralee

Baile Mhuire came into being in the mid-1980s when there was a great need for an interim unit to provide recuperation and respite care for older people in the Tralee and surrounding areas.

Fr. Maurice Brick and the late Sr. Pius Collins, with the help of Social Action, set about the huge task of providing such a service.

Operating for years from a prefab building, in 2014 the new €1.4 million Baile Mhuire Day Care Centre for the elderly was officially opened in Balloonagh, Tralee by the Director General of the Health Service Executive, Tony O'Brien.

Employing 16 people, the facility provides a full range of care to the elderly. Operating five days a week, including Saturdays, the Centre provides personal, nursing, paramedical, social and pastoral care to support older people in living independently and remaining within their own home and community for as long as possible. Staff employed are a combination of full and part time staff including Community Employment and Tús programme Staff who are key to Baile Mhuire survival.





Volunteers were instrumental in the establishment of Baile Mhuire in 1988 and they continue to play a pivotal role in the daily running of the centre. The Board of Management guarantee's the smooth running of the centre in conjunction with the invaluable volunteers who give of their time so freely and generously. Memories of former members live on in the centre with the *Quiet Room* named after Tommy O'Connor and the inner courtyard now *Eileen's Garden* after Nurse Manager Eileen Brick, a beautiful tribute to them both.

A typical day in the new day centre sees the clients of Baile Mhuire enjoy a range of activities focusing on personal care to spiritual time, and light entertainment while their meals are prepared in the state-of-the-art kitchen and served in the spacious dining area. In 2017 the centre expanded its services further with the support of the local community and added 2 fully accessible buses, in partnership with Local Link Kerry, to ensure clients get to and from the centre with ease.

Baile Mhuire have received support from Bon Secours Hospital, Tralee Community Fund, Mercy Order, Dormant Accounts, Rapid Funding, NEWKD, both capital and revenue funding from the HSE, flag days, church gate collections and from the people of Tralee.
