Camphill Communities of Ireland, Dingle Community

Camphill Community Dingle is situated in one of the most beautiful parts of Ireland, in the quiet rural location of Doonsheane just 2 miles outside Dingle town.

In 1993-1994 a group of parents and friends got together to form a local group to invite Camphill to Dingle. 10 years of meetings, fundraising, visits and talks followed and the 44 acres of land were bought. In the autumn of 2004, a group of co-workers moved to Dingle to start building up a community. The land itself had only a tumbled down shed but boasts some of the most beautiful scenery nature could offer. Situated in the idyllic location of Dingle it is surrounded by beautiful sandy beaches, the wild Atlantic ocean, rolling hills, mountains and majestic cliffs which is a true source of inspiration.

Today with a lot of hard work, and with the support of the wider Dingle Community, Camphill contains a ten-bedroom house (Tearman an tSolais) and a converted stone cottage (Tigheen). Co-funded through NEWKD LEADER Programme Camphill now also has a beautiful weaving workshop full of creativity, as well as a therapeutic candle workshop, woodlands, an orchard, a blooming bio-dynamic garden with polytunnels and a bustling farm that supplies the community with all food needs from organic vegetables, fruit, cheese, milk, yoghurts, eggs, beef and lamb. Camphill also benefits from being beside the sea as they can also catch their own fish.

The community has now grown to 35 community members and has evolved to a social care led model.

Case Study

Both land work and crafts play a big part in working life at Camphill. Most of the food produced is consumed and the crafts are sold at the weekly market and at craft fairs. There are also adult education lifeskills workshops, day programmes and school leaver programmes which enable community members to expand on their independence and life choices. There is a significant emphasis on the therapeutic side to Camphill life with music, arts, weaving, dance, yoga, cooking, drama and lots of hiking. Camphill Community Dingle is situated in a Gaeltacht area, which means that Irish is the first language. Though the community is English speaking, a little bit of Irish is learned everyday from the Irish speaking community members. The therapeutic workshops are very much a part of Camphill life and the over all day service is led by the New Directions model which is one where person-centeredness, community inclusion, active citizenship, access to local services and facilities are all integral to the service provided to service users.

Living in an area where arts and crafts are very alive has been very enriching for the community. Local artists offer workshops and members enjoy and take part in the many drama performances, music sessions and exhibitions. Camphill also takes part in many of the local festivals in Dingle each year which are always great fun - the St. Patrick's Day Parade, the Bealtaine Festival in May, the Dingle Film Festival in November, the Food Festival in October, 'Other Voices' Music Festivals, Easter and Christmas Celebrations. Camphill Dingle is truly a wonderful and energetic place to live and work.

Activities include:

- 1. Residential and day services
- 2. Health, wellbeing and personal development
- 3. Personal expression and self-development
- 4. Vocational training and employment opportunities
- 5. Land based therapeutic workshops including: Weavery, Organic Farm and Garden, Forestry, Candle Making Workshops and Food Processing
- 6. Camphill participates in the Dingle Farmers Market seasonally. The market serves a dual purpose for us. It not only gives the opportunity to show and sell products but also to socialize with the local community
- 7. Providing supported employment mentoring
- 8. Accessing local services, e.g. gym and fitness classes
- 9. Commencing in Spring 2020 Camphill will be a host location under the Kerry Social Farming Initiative.
