NEWKD in partnership with Kerry Group are delighted to announce The Kerry Food Hub, Firies as the second recipient of the Community Vibrancy Recognition Programme.

This is a three year initiative (2017-2019) aimed at recognising the diversity and vibrancy of community work throughout the region. Every year NEWKD works with over 500 community groups, businesses and initiatives under our 4 Strategic Pillars:

- Social Supports
- Employment Services
- Enterprise and Rural Tourism
- Community, Environment and Rural Development

The 'Community Vibrancy Recognition Programme' will pay tribute to 10 recipients each year. Each project will be selected for their uniqueness, vibrancy and responsiveness to addressing local need. Recipients will be recognised locally through the NEWKD structures which operate in Tralee, Listowel, Castleisland and Dingle, and will promote best practices and innovative solutions in social, economic and environmental development, while giving recognition to community leadership and entrepreneurs.

The Kerry Food Hub is a brand new facility incorporating four food production units completed to the highest standard. The facility is located on a green field site on the outskirts of Firies Village, Co. Kerry.

After NEWKD initially sourced funding from Enterprise Ireland some years ago Firies Community Enterprise Development Ltd. spearheaded the project to success with the premises officially opened by An Taoiseach Enda Kenny, T.D. on 27th March 2017. 'The food and drinks sector continues to be one of the cornerstones of Ireland's economic recovery, and Kerry's lush, unspoiled landscape and pristine coast gives us access to some of the world's best agricultural and seafood produce,' said Martin Brosnan, Chairperson. This was certainly the central ethos at the design stage of the facility, purposely built on a greenfield site that blends naturally with the local environment and compliments both the people and place interactions of the local community.

The units are completely self-contained and comply with all food quality health and safety standards. There is currently 100% occupancy with four businesses and sixteen people employed. The site will enable further development opportunities.





Case Study

The Kerry Food Hub FIRIES, CO. KERRY

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The premises was officially opened by An Taoiseach Enda Kenny, T.D. March 2017

Firies native and former Kerry footballer Donal Daly performed the official duties on 27th September, 2014, turning the first sod before the diggers moved in on a site that was to become The Kerry Food Hub. The construction phase attracted up to 50 jobs locally.

To achieve such a superb standard of food production, facility funding was secured from NEWKD, Enterprise Ireland, Kerry County Council, Kerry Local Enterprise Office and Killarney Technology Innovation. The project is also supported with loans from the Clann Credo Social Investment Fund.

Firies Community Enterprise Development Ltd. consists of a group of volunteers who combine their skills with the aim of making their local area a better place to live and work. The Kerry Food Hub is the first of its kind in Kerry and is the only facility which is purposely built for small food production in the county, thus helping to facilitate a rapidly expanding sector. The hub also helps and supports clients promote their business using individual and community networks and skills.

The Kerry Food Hub is an excellent example of how business start-ups can be supported through production facilities support. Operating at capacity, the hub is currently the base and production site for:

Unit 1: Cordal Goats Cheese

Unit 2: Harty Nutrition Ltd.

Unit 3: Leen Salads/Krave

Unit 4: Fruity Farm

The hub, which also accommodates a sub-office for Taste Kerry, will help to create further job growth, encourage up-skilling and promote better food tourism. All of this will have a positive impact on what is a rapidly growing local community in terms of housing, development, schools and greater community activism.
