SOME FACTS

- Each group is diverse, uniting individuals of different nationalities, abilities, and cultural backgrounds. Participants also vary in age, creating a dynamic and inclusive environment where different perspectives, experiences, and traditions can be shared and appreciated.
- Some of the arts and crafts done in groups are embroidery, crochet, quilling, quilting, knitting, crosstitch, colouring, painting, jewellery making, macrame, button art, origami, book folding, basket making from paper straws, decoration making, diamond art, card making, clay art, drawing, stone painting, sewing, cake decorating, punch needle art, bag making, decoupage, dried flower art, patchwork, weaving, floristry, scratch art and scrapbook making.
- In October 2024 3 groups from Ballyduff, Ballybunion and Tralee came together for a NEWKD Craft Circle Halloween Crafts Workshop, it was attended by more than 70 adults and children.

MY CREATIVE JOURNEY -ALEKSANDRA'S STORY

Since I can remember, creativity has been a part of me. It comes naturally, as if it has always been there, waiting to express itself. One of my earliest memories is begging my grandmother to teach me how to knit when I was just four or five. At first, she didn't believe I could do it, but after much persistence, she gave in. To everyone's surprise, I picked it up quickly, and from that moment, my love for crafting only grew.

I don't limit myself to one particular type of art. Instead, I allow creativity to flow when it comes. Sometimes, there is a period of silence, a time when I create nothing, and then suddenly, inspiration strikes, and I immerse myself in a new project. I've explored various techniques, from macrame and woodworking to weaving baskets from paper tubes. When I started basket weaving, it felt so natural—almost as if I had done it before in another life. What began as small baskets for pens soon evolved into intricate jewellery boxes, vases, and decorative pieces of all shapes and sizes.

Some of my recent projects include Christmas baubles made from colourful ribbons, abstract designs drawn with markers, and handcrafted presents like 3D guardian angels for baby showers or weddings. I also love macrame, creating floating shelves and wall hangings. One of my favourite projects was a collaboration with my son and our neighbour when they were finishing primary school. We combined macrame with wood engraving to create a beautiful thank-you gift for their school—a unique, handmade piece that also served as a promotional artwork.

Inspiration often comes unexpectedly. During a holiday, I came across tiny spiral seashells, only about 5mm long. I immediately knew I had to collect them and later placed them in tiny glass bottles with sand to create special memory keepsakes. Another time, when a dear friend was struggling with sleep, I crafted a dreamcatcher for her. Seeing her appreciation and knowing it brought her comfort was incredibly fulfilling.

I don't create for a living, and perhaps that's what makes it so enjoyable. There's no pressure, only pure joy. Crafting provides balance in my life—it's a form of therapy, a way to reconnect with myself, and find peace.

Joining the NEWKD Craft Circle in Lyreacompane has been a wonderful experience. It's not just about learning new techniques but also about sharing, teaching, and being part of a community of likeminded creative people. When I introduced paper basket weaving to the group, I wasn't sure how it would be received. But the enthusiasm was incredible! We took our time, step by step—rolling tubes, painting, weaving, and varnishing. Seeing the excitement and pride on everyone's faces when they completed their baskets was the most rewarding part.

I'm always eager to learn new skills and try techniques I haven't explored yet. Creativity is a journey, and being part of a group like this makes it even more meaningful. If I were to give advice to someone wanting to start arts and crafts, I'd say: just begin. Don't overthink it, don't fear mistakes—creativity is about expression, and there are no wrong answers. I'm grateful to be part of this circle, to create, share, and inspire. And I can't wait to see what comes next.
