Jobs Fair 2025: Jobseekers and employers gathered at the Rose Hotel in Tralee on Tuesday the 20th May. The event featured over 30 of the county's leading companies, offering hundreds of vacancies across various sectors. It was organised by NEWKD in partnership with The Rose Hotel and Tralee Chamber Alliance. Attendees got to explore opportunities in sectors such as office administration, IT, accounting, finance, hospitality, manufacturing, food production and retail. In addition to employer booths, a careers clinic provided job-search support including CVs, job interview preparation and information on upskilling and professional development, as well as workshops for both employees and employers on employing non-Irish citizens.



The <u>NEWKD Craft Circle</u> has been bringing people together through creativity for the past two years. It all began in Tralee on March 6, 2023, when I - Kristine - decided to revive something I had loved doing years ago.

Inspired by the joy of crafting and the power of connection, I wanted to create a space where

More than just a creative outlet, it fosters mental well-being, social inclusion, meaningful connections, and a strong sense of community. Tús Case Study: Joe was employed with NEWKD on the Tús Community Work Placement initiative in Castleisland, and was with Revamp Furniture for 16 months, as a furniture restorer with Revamp. Joe is a skilled carpenter and brought his expertise and craftsmanship to the project contributing to many restored items donated to Revamp. Joe has a great flair for carpentry, with a unique approach to design, a strong attention to detail, and ability to create aesthetically pleasing and functional woodwork. An example of Joe's creativity and skill as a carpenter was to repurpose old broken furniture into a sweet cart giving new life to

materials that would otherwise have been thrown away. The sweet cart – which has since been sold! – is a charming, functional addition to any setting, whether it's for a community event, a market, or as part of a local initiative. Joe brought a very positive, enthusiastic attitude to his work and was a pleasure to work with!

Kerry Local Areas Employment Service (KLAES) Case Study: Tom, a 57 year old male, unemployed for last 7 years, joined KLAES in August 2024 after completing his Bs(c) Hons in Manufacturing & Mechanical Engineering NQ Level 8 at Munster Technology University in May 2024. During his time with KLAES along with working with his employment officer. Tom availed of a Safe Pass with SICAP (Dave Fitzgibbon), a Forklift certification course with SICAP (Jennifer O Sullivan Coffey - YEI Programme) and also had access to a laptop to help further his studies with NEWKD Laptop Loan Scheme initiated by Rita Griffin. Tom's commitment to attending the activation meetings, updating his CV and LinkedIn, and participating in the relevant training programs shows how a proactive approach to his career development returned him rewards. Tom gained full-time employment with a local engineering



company in January 2025, showing that working with all the relevant programmes available within NEWKD can make a difference. It's clear that the combination of his educational background in Manufacturing & Mechanical Engineering, the hands-on support from his Employment Officer, and the programs he accessed, played a big role in his success. It's also inspiring that he was able to put everything he learned into action and secure a job in the field that aligns with his qualifications. Tom has made an impressive transition from being unemployed for the last seven years to securing full-time employment in a relatively short period of time, thanks to the help of KLAES and the many elements of NEWKD current supports. Wishing Tom every success with his future.

Supports for Integration Through Employment: In my role with NEWKD I provide help with CV preparation, employment and training supports / advice, and information. I work with migrants, refugees, and asylum seekers, but also with the Irish community. In any given day I could help prepare a CV or a cover letter, talk to someone about possible training or courses in Kerry College, or help a person filling out forms. When I cannot help someone directly, I try to put them in contact with the right support. Some of my clients have been with me for quite a while now, and I have seen how they have progressed in our community and built a life for themselves. I meet people by appointment but because some people find it difficult to get to Tralee I also link in with people by WhatsApp, email and even Zoom. I can be contacted by WhatsApp or message on 0874738499 and am available Monday, Tuesday and half-day Wednesday.

Men's Sheds: NEWKD supports a number of men's sheds in Asdee, Ballyduff, Ballyheigue, Ballybunion, Tralee, Listowel and Dingle. These are part of the Irish Men's Shed Association, a national organisation supporting over 450 sheds. No two sheds are the same. In fact you don't even need a physical shed. Some operate as choirs, walking groups, cycling groups, gardening groups and so on. Kerry sheds tend to focus on woodwork and gardening, with an ever-increasing effort on environmental initiatives: some make bird, bee, bat and owl boxes to support community efforts, with others involved in the creation and development of biodiversity gardens and allotments. The main focus of sheds is to support men to support each other, and the most important item in any shed is a kettle! All are welcome and the social side – chats, card games, days out, etc. - is the most important aspect of shed life. As part of the national commitment to the sheds each county has a designated peer support member, who is the main contact with the national organisation. Network meetings are organised 3 or 4 times a year in our area where local sheds meet, share ideas, look at funding opportunities and other matters. Over the years these meetings have resulted in initiatives and training being rolled out, including in physical and mental health, cancer screenings and digital technology. Members often comment that they would not have availed of these without the confidence and the solidarity of their local shed. All are welcome, there is a role and a place for all that wish to participate. Sheds are always looking for new members and a warm welcome is guaranteed. We would love to see new sheds and new members.

Home Visitation Service: NEWKD has been operating its Home Visitation Service in North Kerry since

2018. This innovative project was the brainchild of Anita Bodenham and Geraldine Kelly, Rural Social Scheme (RSS) Supervisors, and helps isolated and vulnerable older persons stay connected socially within their community through weekly social visits. It is reliant on RSS participants and community volunteers, and all involved adhere to strict practices and policies in engaging with the older person. The Home Visitation Service would not be possible without: RSS participants, who have been immense from the very

beginning of this initiative and work tirelessly:

Continued commitment and support from HSE's Cork-Kerry Community Healthcare Team and PHN's; and

Community volunteers who are all vital to the continued success of the Home Visitation service.

NEWKD works closely with the community and runs other complimentary projects such as Home Maintenance Service, Meals

on Wheels and Senior Alert Scheme. We aim to strengthen links between service users and services available, including HSE (PHN's / Community Healthcare Team), Meals on Wheels, Local Link, An Garda Siochana and other local and county wide services. RSS participants and Volunteers call on service users once a week at an agreed time to chat with and offer companionship and a listening ear. Our team are not allowed to do cooking, cleaning or attend to medical needs, etc. They are there to support and link older people with services that exist in their community, keep a gentle eye on them and make sure they know that someone cares.
