

WORLDWIDE KNIT IN PUBLIC DAY CELEBRATING CREATIVITY AND COMMUNITY



Worldwide Knit in Public Day is a vibrant annual celebration of creativity, connection, and craftsmanship. Held every second Saturday in June, this global event invites knitters, crocheters, and makers of all kinds to gather in public spaces-parks, cafés, libraries, and festivals-to share their passion for yarn and handmade art.

What began as a simple idea to bring knitters together has grown into the largest knitter-run event in the world. It's an opportunity for people of all ages and skill levels, from seasoned pros to enthusiastic beginners, to come together, inspire one another, and showcase the joy and value of crafting in community.

In 2025, the celebration took place on Saturday, June 14th, and it was the perfect chance to bring out our yarn, needles, and creative spirit.

This year, we were delighted to host our local Knit in Public gathering as part of Féile na mBláth -The Park Festival in Tralee. Nestled within the welcoming atmosphere of the big events tent, we shared laughter, stories, and stitches with familiar faces and new friends alike.

Crafters of all ages and nationalities joined in, chatting about patterns, wool, techniques, and everything in between. The sense of community was heartwarming-proof that creativity knows no boundaries and that crafting truly brings people together.

Worldwide Knit in Public Day is more than just an event; it's a reminder of the power of handmade traditions, shared joy, and creative expression.

CREATIVE MINDS - MEET NEWKD CRAFT CIRCLE BALLYHEIGUE GROUP FACILITATOR AND MEMBER ANCILLA

What type of crafting do you enjoy the most? I enjoy most crafts but cardmaking and working with card/paper would be my favourite craft.

How did you get into arts and crafts? I have been crafting from a young age. It would have started with sewing, knitting and making things from the cereal box cardboard.

When do you feel most inspired to create? When I see craft ideas on Pinterest and craft groups and want to try and make them and then put my own twist on it. I like making cards for family and friends as I know what they like and try to incorporate that in my cards.

What's your must-have craft supply? A Die-cutting machine. It's a must for cutting out intricate details in card/paper.

Do you prefer working on one project at a time or having multiple projects going? I could have several different projects going at any time. I recently made a macrame feather for a wall hanging. It was my first time doing macrame.

What's the longest you've ever spent on a single craft project? I recently completed a large crystal art picture which took a lot of hours to complete.

Do you listen to music, podcasts, or watch TV while crafting? I always have music playing while I'm crafting.

Do you enjoy upcycling (turning old materials into new crafts)? I take elements from cards I have received and use them in the cards I make.

If you could take a class with any famous artist or crafter (past or present), who would it be? It would have to be Sara Davies. She is CEO of Crafters Companion, and she is also a dragon on the UK Dragons Den programme.

What's the most unconventional item you've used in a craft? That's a difficult one. One that comes to mind is using the netting that fruit come in to use as a background stencil on card.

What's your funniest or biggest craft fail? Putting a card together without checking that the card opening was the right way, so when I tried to open the card, the detail on the front of the card was upside down.

What's your favourite handmade gift you've ever given? A "new baby" shadow box I made for my best friends' daughter.

What's one tip or piece of advice you'd give to someone just starting out in arts & crafts? Give it a go. There is such a variety of arts and crafts out there, try as many as you can and you will find one that you keep coming back to. Join a local NEWKD Craft Circle, there are such talented and creative people within the group that are happy to show you what they create and how to do it. I have got to try so many different crafts since joining. Also, don't worry how your first project goes as you are still learning, just enjoy the process. Look up Pinterest and other crafty sites/groups for ideas and see how they have put a project
